<u>CLINICAL II</u>

SHIFT 1 & 2- Getting to know you.

- 1. Student identifies the location and use of BLS equipment on the ambulance.
- 2. Student identifies the location and use of safety equipment on the ambulance.
- 3. Student identifies the location and use of the radio system on the ambulance.
- 4. Student identifies their role in the standard operating procedures of the ambulance in various situations.
- 5. Student demonstrates the ability to obtain an accurate and reliable set of vital signs including pulse, respiration, blood pressure and lung sounds.
- 6. Student demonstrates ability to conduct physical assessments and patient interviewing at the discretion of the preceptor for BLS patients.
- 7. Student demonstrates knowledge and procedures of an EMT for the treatment of patients and uses them under the discretion of the preceptor.

SHIFT 3 through 15 - Interviews, Patient Assessment, Documentation, BLS & ALS Team Leader
